

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR HOMEOWNERS & TENANTS

Your "home" should be a safe and secure place for you to enjoy; every home needs maintenance and attention to ensure it remains a safe place for everyone who lives there.

The following information for ACFN tenants and homeowners has been developed to help you care for your home, whether rented or owned.

## **Important Information for Tenants**

- 1. Tenant is responsible for any damage done in the unit.
- 2. Tenant must keep premises clean, safe, tidy and dispose of all garbage in the proper manner inside and outside or be subject to bylaw.
- 3. Tenant is responsible for cutting of lawn and snow removal.
- 4. No structural alterations, painting, etc., shall be done by tenant without written consent from ACFN Housing.
- 5. Tenant may not change locks.
- 6. Tenant must not disturb or be a nuisance to their neighbors with partying, loud music or guests.
- 7. Tenant should insure their own personal effects and furniture from fire, theft, water damage, etc., and also consider liability coverage for their own protection.
- 8. Tenant is responsible for payment of utilities, heating oil and water bill.



## **Important Information for Homeowners**

- 1. Homeowner is responsible for all repairs/renovations to their home.
- 2. Homeowner should carry homeowner's insurance for the house and contents.
- Homeowner must keep premises clean, safe and dispose of all garbage in the proper manner or be subject to bylaw.
- 4. Homeowner is responsible for cutting of lawn and snow removal.
- 5. Homeowner is responsible for payment of utilities, heating oil and water bill.

## **Home Maintenance**

The following indicates maintenance items around the home which require attention during the year for both rental units and homeowners:

- · change furnace filter every 6 months
- change HRV filters every month
- clean range hood filters
- inspect fire extinguishers
- test smoke/carbon dioxide detectors
- · check for water leaks around sinks/tubs/toilet

While renting or owning a home is an important responsibility, paying attention to the maintenance needs of your home ensures it remains a safe, secure place for you and your family to enjoy!
