

Letter to Members – May/June 2024

FROM ACFN CHIEF AND COUNCIL

To say May was eventful would be an understatement! This season started once again with a crisis that required us to activate our emergency plan and our team got to work quickly as the MWF-017 wildfire began to threaten areas of Fort McMurray. The evacuation of Beacon Hill, Abasand, Prairie Creek and Grayling Terrace impacted some of our Members living in those locations, so we rapidly deployed support to ensure they were well-equipped to deal with the evolving situation.

Fortunately, the wildfire was brought under control quickly and the evacuees were able to return home, but the experience was a powerful reminder of both the wildfire that threatened Fort Chipewyan last year and of course the 2016 wildfire in Fort McMurray. We have seen the impacts of climate change, including a shortened winter season with milder temperatures and reduced precipitation as well as increased temperatures during the spring and summer months. The truth is that wildfire will likely be a significant part of our experience in the future, and so we are continuing to build and strengthen our already robust emergency response.

We also want to take this opportunity to thank all those who participated in fighting the wildfire outside Fort McMurray. We know it takes a huge effort to control a fire of this magnitude, and we are deeply appreciative of all those who put themselves forward to ensure the safety of others.
